



Our cast of 39 have been giving it their all with twice weekly rehearsals for 'Guys and Dolls'. We welcome back many of our experienced performers, welcome so many new faces to Bendigo and the company, and are supporting younger members of 'Tribe' and our Bendigo school's community to make the leap onto the 'big' stage.

'Guys and Dolls' is a timeless Broadway Classic, and the Creative and Production team have purposely decided to keep BTC's mainstage show in that era. The setting is the 1940's in Damon Runyon's New York City. With beautiful music and lyrics by Frank Loesser, the book is by Jo Swerling and Abe Burrows and is based on 'The Idyll of Miss Sarah Brown' that was written in 1933. The story line borrows characters and plot elements from other Runyon stories, such as 'Pick the Winner.' The movie we all know and love was released in 1955, starring Frank Sinatra, Marlon Brando, Jean Simmons and Vivian Blaine. There are elements taken from both the movie and Broadway and Revival editions of the musical in our own performance, plus some new and innovative theatrical ideas and elements of contemporary theatre. The sets, costume and choreography, whilst based in the era of the 1940's, are exciting and reimagined.

I am leading the direction, supported greatly by the creative talents of Thomas Moore. I appreciate Thomas' amazing ability as a dramaturg and accent coach. What I am most excited about is working alongside Vashti Lamaro on the invigorating choreography. It has been superb that I have been able to use my choreographic skills to assist the directional ideas of the show, and present a show where the movement and direction go hand in hand. Heading up our musical department is

Meg Martin, an experienced instrumental teacher and orchestral leader. The songs are soaring with such enthusiastic numbers as 'Sit Down You're Rockin' The Boat' and 'Luck Be a Lady', and beautiful ballads such as 'If I Were a Bell'.

The cast have been so supportive of each other, and no matter what role, each member is being given more than a moment to shine on stage. Leads Zoe Czempinski (Sarah), Emma Kelly (Adelaide), Daniel Sexton (Sky) and Luke Oliver (Nathan), supported by Joel McDonald (Nicely Nicely), Robert Holian

(Benny) and Jakoby Appleby (Rusty) are leading the way, sharing their experience and challenging themselves with the complex characters they have been presented with. The Hot Box dancers are kicking their heels up, the Crapshooters are learning the ins and outs of illegal gambling and the

Mission Band are trying to convert us all and save us from sin! I am loving working with such a diverse cast. There have been so many highlights so far, and rehearsals are hard work, but full of laughter and joy.

B Sharp are taking a pause whilst Guys and Dolls is gearing up for its Ulumbarra performance mid-September.



Blood on the Clocktower

The Bendigo Theatre Company has this year dipped its toes into narrative social games with the Pandemonium Institute's worldwide hit "Blood on the Clocktower". Following three test runs at the beginning of the year, the first ticketed event took place on June 25th, with others scheduled **for August 27, October 29, and December 3.**

Blood on the Clocktower casts participants in the roles of villagers in the small, rural town of Ravenswood Bluff; among them is cast one villager who is secretly a powerful Demon, selecting players during the night to kill off. Most players are Townsfolk, given their own abilities to uncover information, protect themselves or their allies, and must work together to uncover the demon and get rid of them before time runs out. Confusing matters are Outsiders with abilities that confuse or obscure information for their Townsfolk allies, and Minions who help the Demon stay hidden. Each game takes place over multiple rounds; night phases on the Patricia Lyon Black Box Theatre stage where powers are activated and the Demon kills, and day phases where players are given free reign to exit the stage and engage in private conversations where they try to determine who is telling the truth, who is lying, and whose information is even reliable at all.

Operated by Storyteller Thomas Moore, tickets for each event are only \$10 for two hours, 7:00-9:00pm, of spooky fun and intricate mystery.

TENX10 is a presentation of ten plays, each up to ten minutes in length. The plays written by local amateur playwrights and can be directed and performed by novice or experienced people.

This year's theme is CELEBRATION or CELEBRATE.

Once plays have been selected, an expression of interest will be advertised for directors.

A Director's Workshop will take place shortly after. The date will be confirmed.

A casting night will be held at the Patricia Lyon Black Box Theatre on Tuesday 3 September at 7pm, where

plays are discussed and all attendees are encouraged to read for a part it is important this is not to be considered an audition, but rather a fun experience. All attendees are asked to complete the online form nominating plays/characters they are interested in. Casting will be done that night and directors will advise all cast members and confirm with the Production Manager within two days.

Directors are responsible for managing rehearsal times and for ensuring the cast is given adequate time to rehearse as a full cast. A minimum of two mandatory rehearsals will be held: Tuesday October 8 and Tuesday October 29.

Production week will start Sunday 17 Nov with rehearsals scheduled for Monday 18 and Tuesday 19 Nov, and will include full lighting, audio and visual requirements together with a fully completed tech script and a dress rehearsal.

Plays will be performed on November 21, 22, 23, 28, 29, and 30 at 7:30pm and 24 Nov and 1 Dec at 24 at 2pm.

Victoria's Child Safe Standards

Child safety is important to everyone at all levels in your

organisation. You document how you find, avoid, and stop

risks of child abuse or harm.

An extract from Keva Lloyd's address to the Bendigo Historical Society - "Thespians and Divas"

So, you think it hard to learn lines?

In 1879, it became a topic of conversation around Bendigo, ... gossip that there was some doubt whether there would be an Easter Fair that year.

In their wisdom (and despite some criticism from a small section of the community), the Sandhurst City Dramatic Club booked the Royal Princess Theatre in View Street for the whole of the Easter week, six nights straight! Remember that the Royal Princess at the time would hold 2000 patrons!

The Easter Fair did occur in that year, but the City Dramatic Club were undaunted and pressed on with their season of six nights. They didn't perform the one production for six nights however! In fact, they performed FIVE full-length plays and ONE one-act farce to bumper crowds. Many of the cast members appeared in most if not all plays. Bear in mind that the members of the Company were amateurs and likely held down day jobs as well!

Mr. Coleman, the secretary of the Company played a leading role in all six plays and in the final play for the season, took a dual role so SEVEN different characters in one week and a performance EVERY night!



Vern Wall: 100 Productions and Counting!

I was asked to write a short article about my involvement in Bendigo Theatre Company and to try to make it sound interesting. Well, I will give it a go. Firstly, my involvement in theatre and in particular with BTC is a two-way street. I feel I have got back more than I have put in and I hope that is the same for other members. My involvement goes back a touch over thirty years and in counting up the productions I have been involved in (I miscalculated at first but on rechecking) I came up with the total of ninety-nine productions. It must be recognised though that some of this involvement was very small such as building a set piece or making a particular prop but others shows were huge and may have involved directing, set construction and production management at the same time. I guess this means that my next show, 'Guys and Dolls' will be my one hundredth. It certainly will be my Swan Song as far as acting goes.

What has changed over this time?

Well, it has become so much more professional. All the technical aspects are amazing and add a complexity we could only dream about. With this though, comes more red tape and management of productions - which is necessary. Did we do a risk assessment for some of the set pieces that went wrong, such as a croquet ball falling into the orchestra pit and landing on someone's head? Probably should have!

What has been some of the highlights of this time.

Seeing some of the young actors who started out as just kids progressing to professional careers and catching up with them many years later, or watching the sheer joy on the faces of a cast when they accept the applause. There is no feeling like it.

What has been your favourite show to act in?

This would have to be 'Man of La Mancha' It is a very powerful show with wonderful music and we had a very strong cast. The feeling on stage at the end of the opening night was one I will never forget. I still get tingles up my spine as I remember the music reaching a crescendo and hearing sobs coming from some audience members who had been moved to tears.

What is the future for BTC?

I feel that the future is very bright for the theatre company. We have some of the best facilities in regional Victoria as regards to our wonderful Arts Shed, which is the envy of many community companies. If we can continue its development with an improved black box theatre, toilets, changerooms and storage areas it will be even better and more utilized and functional than it has ever been before. Secondly, to have the Ulumbarra Theatre as our primary performance venue is truly wonderful. I am looking forward to what comes next for the company and hope all BTC members are equally enthused to continue the journey together.
